**A. KWL: What skills can be tapped by having students complete a pre reading task such as a KWL?**

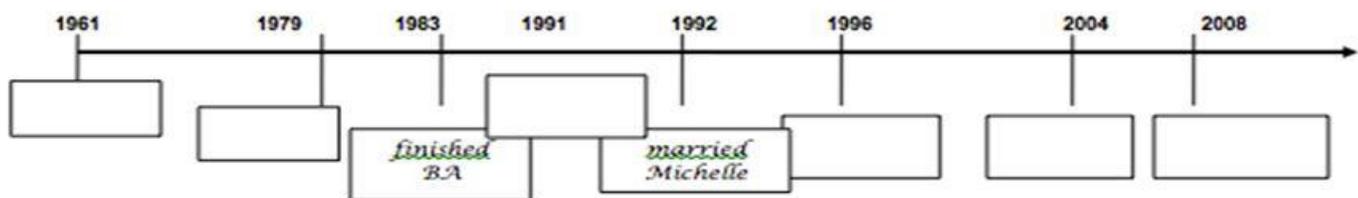
